Diploma Requirements:

All Obridge courses are taught at the college-preparatory level.

The minimum diploma requirements are as follows:

English	4 Credits with major concentration in composition, reading for information and literature.
Mathematics	4 Credits, one of which must be Algebra 1 or its equivalent, or a higher-level math course.
Science	3 credits in science, two of which must have a laboratory component. 3 credits: 1 credit World History, 1 credit American History, .5 credits in American Government and .5 credits in Economics
Social Studies	Not required for high school Graduation, but required for admission to state universities.
Foreign Language	1 credit Fine Art or Performing Art (Example: Art or Theatre)
Art	1 credit of Physical Education and Health
Physical Education	8 credits; 4 credits in a major area of interest; 4 credits in elective course, which may be combined to allow for a second major of interest, a minor area of interest (3 credits), individual elective courses, or intensive reading or mathematics intervention courses.

*For the students who transfer to our school for graduation, they need to provide the transcripts from the 9th grade of their previous school and complete the remaining credit courses according to the graduation requirements of our school. The credits taken in our school must include the required courses for Grade 12, and should not be less than 1/4 of the credits required for graduation (i.e. 6 credits). The cumulative GPA of all courses (including transfer credits) shall not be lower than 2.0.

More than 50% of our students have chosen AP and Honor courses, and students with excellent performance are allowed to choose up to 5 high-level courses each academic year, so as to strengthen their academic ability and make full preparations for subsequent university studies.

During the 2021-22 school year, 207 students sat for 662 AP exams. 91% of AP exams earned scores of 3 or higher. Given the fact that our Obridge Program stresses the importance of process, some of our students elect not to sit for AP exams.
