## AP Program: Class of 2022

We currently offer 24 AP courses in English, science, mathematics, sociology, foreign languages and arts. Many students will choose to take an AP exam to demonstrate proficiency in a subject, even without officially taking an AP course.

More than $50 \%$ of our students have chosen AP and Honor courses, and students with excellent performance are allowed to choose up to 5 high-level courses each academic year, so as to strengthen their academic ability and make full preparations for subsequent university studies.

During the 2021-22 school year, 207 students sat for 662 AP exams. $91 \%$ of AP exams earned scores of 3 or higher. Given the fact that our Obridge Program stresses the importance of process, some of our students elect not to sit for AP exams.
